




### STEPS – GETTING STARTED



1. Go to the website: [canva.com](https://canva.com)
2. Login or Sign Up: Top right, click on “Login” or “Sign Up” to create an account. You can sign up with Google, Facebook, your email, or another way (e.g., Microsoft, Clever, etc.).
3. Start: Once logged in, you will enter Canva's Homepage. All content is divided into various categories; for each category, you can find specific templates using the menu on the left. You can also search for specific content using the search bar. Top right, you can click on “Create a design” to start creating your project.






**PREPARE THE ACTIVITY**


1. Select the type of content you want to create: use the search bar to find specific templates to create a timeline. Then, click on the chosen template to start customising it.



2. Start editing your project. All the elements (text, images, etc.) can be edited: you can change the font, colour, size, position, and even add effects and animations. You can add new elements by using the left black menu and change the project title by clicking on the space at the top.




3. You can personalise all elements, delete those you don't need, duplicate them and add new ones: you can search for them using the search bar or upload them from your device using the black menu on the left.



### SAVE AND PUBLISH

1. All your changes and progress are automatically saved.
2. Once finished, click on “Share” at the top right: you can share it via social media or link. You can also download your project.
