


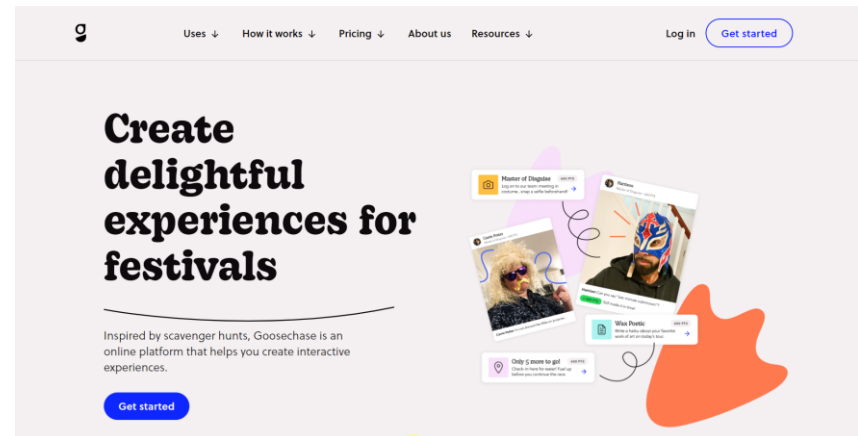

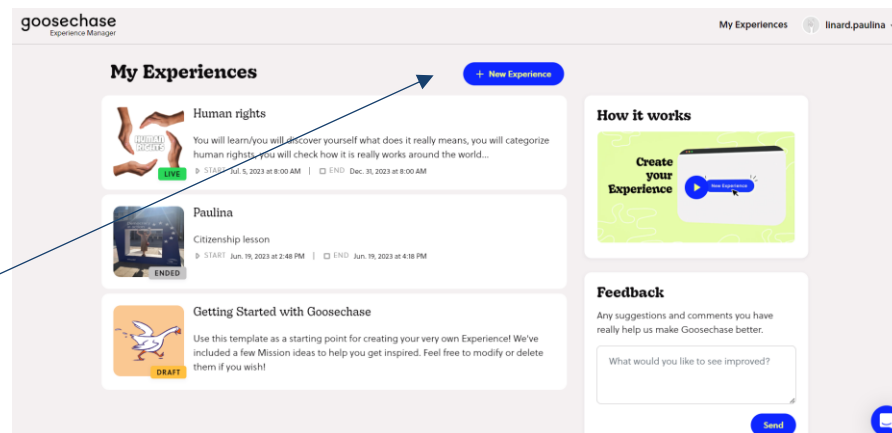
STEPS – GETTING STARTED

1. Create an account on [goosechase](#) and log in.

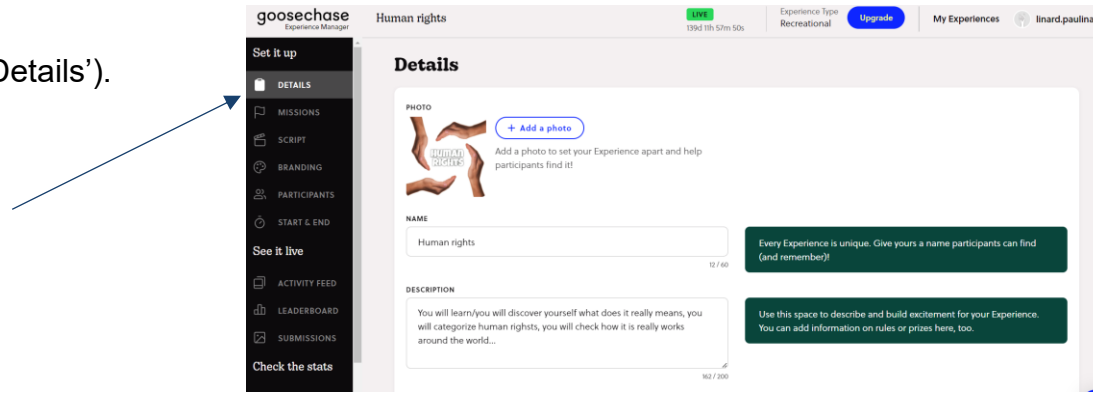


PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

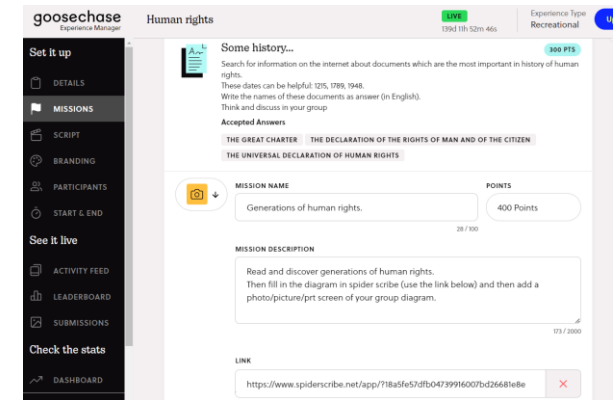
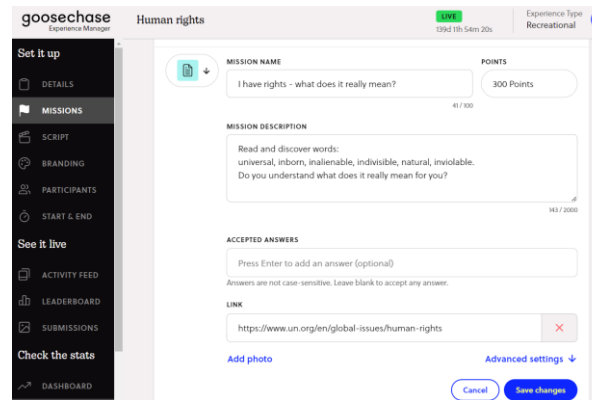
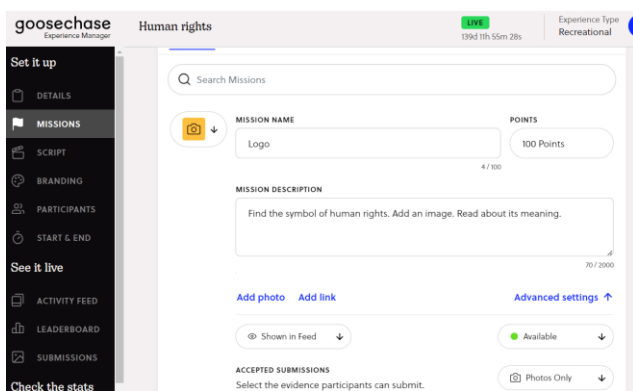
1. Click on 'New Experience'.



2. Name it and describe it (go to 'Details').



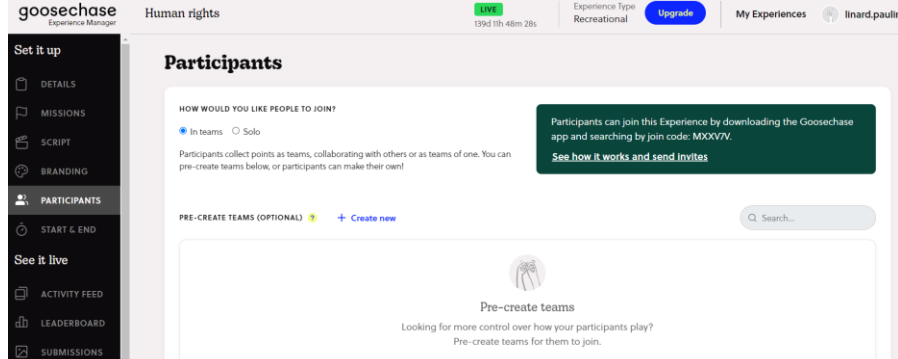
3. Add mission by mission. Decide what type of mission you want, what kind of sources your students will use (add links eg. to webpages, to SpiderScribe diagram, pictures etc.), what you want them to do (describe their activity) and what kind of results you want them to present you (written answers or photos/pictures), decide how many points they get.





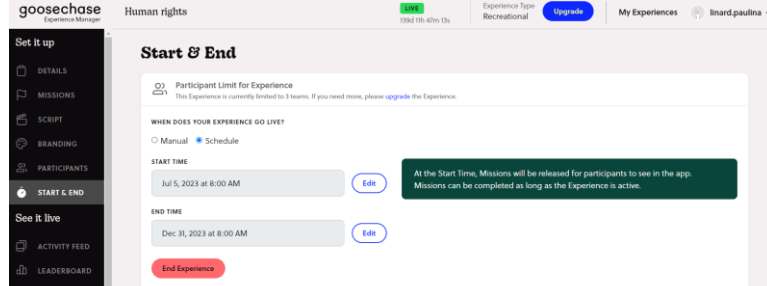
SAVE AND PUBLISH

1. When you finish missions, go to PARTICIPANTS, decide if you want them to work in groups or solo (free option is for 3 groups of 5 students or just 3 students). You can decide if students can create their own groups.
2. The easiest way for students to join your experience is by using a code.
3. The last thing – decide how to start – manual or prepare your own schedule, and click UPGRADE.

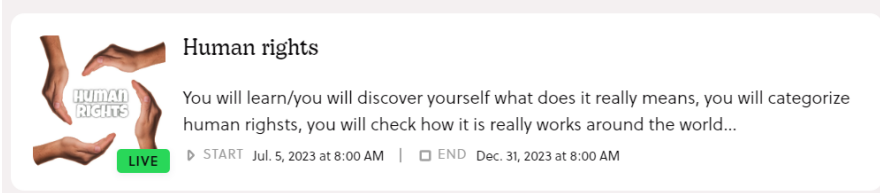

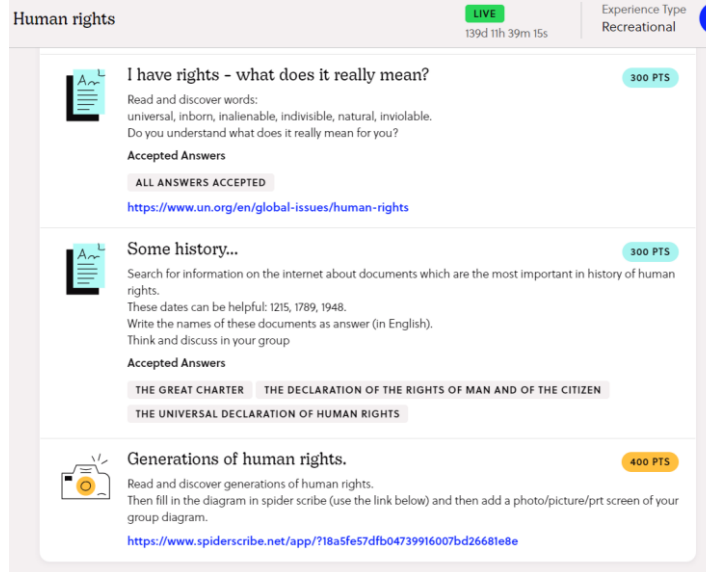
