
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1. Go to the website storyjumper.com

2. Sign up - click the blue button on the right side at the top navigation bar and create an account or "Login" if you already have an account.



PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

1. Click the button "Add Class" and enter the required information (Class Name, etc.).


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- 2. Click on the "People" tab and click "+ Add Students" to see add students' options:
- If you're using Google Classroom, import your Google Classroom students. Give them the "Join Class" link and the Class Password.



 If you're not using Google Classroom, the other option is to manually add students accounts by clicking "Add 1 student" or "Add multiple students" Enter each student's name on the pages they are assigned to, so they'll know which pages to focus on.






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6. Design your own characters who look like you, your friends, and family. Upload your own photos or use our artwork of props and scenes.



7. Add your voice, background, music and sound effects.








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SAVE AND PUBLISH

- 2. Share books with students and parents.






